Brenden Hubbard called the meeting to order at 601pm.

Kevin Bazan made a motion to open the public hearing. Michelle Dwight 2nd the motion. Motion carries 5-0.

Brenden Hubbard advised the committee that due to the 24hr turnaround on the minutes they could make a motion to accept minutes from 1/10/24 at deliberative on 2/3/24 to give more time for the committee to read the minutes.

TOWN WARRANT ARTICLES - read by Brenden Hubbard, Chair

TOWN MEETING WARRANT SB2 TOWN OF WINCHESTER STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the Town of Winchester, in the County of Cheshire in said state, qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Winchester School in said Winchester on **Saturday the 3rd of February** next 2024 at nine o'clock in the forenoon to discuss, debate and amend warrant articles #1 through #35 and to receive the reports of the selectmen, town treasurer and other town officers including the agents and committees, and act thereon. The final vote will be by the official ballot on **Tuesday**, **March 12**, **2024**.

You are hereby notified to meet at the Winchester School, 85 Parker St.in said Winchester on Tuesday the 12th of March next 2024 at eight o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects. The Polls not to close an hour earlier than seven of the clock in the afternoon.

Article 1: To choose all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year.

Article 2: Shall the Town of Winchester raise and appropriate as an operating budget, not including appropriations by special warrant articles and other appropriations voted separately, the amounts set forth on the budget posted with the warrant or as amended by vote of the first session, for the purposes set forth therein, totaling \$4,515,353(Four million five hundred fifteen thousand three hundred fifty-three dollars). Should this article be defeated, the default budget shall be \$4,440,464 (Four million four hundred forty thousand four hundred sixty-four dollars), which is the same as last year, with certain adjustments required by previous action of the Town of Winchester or by law; or the governing body may hold one special meeting, in accordance with RSA 40:13, X and XVI, to take up the issue of a revised operating budget only. (Majority vote required)

This article will not affect taxation. Should this article be defeated, the default budget shall be \$383,449 (Three hundred eighty-three thousand four hundred forty-nine dollars). If the appropriation proposed in the article is not approved, the default amount shall be deemed to have been approved. "With certain

adjustments required by previous action of the Town of Winchester or by law; or the governing body may hold one special meeting, in accordance with RSA 40:13, X and XVI, to take up the issue of a revised operating budget only. (Majority vote required)

This article will not affect taxation. Should this article be defeated, the default budget shall be \$501,760 (Five hundred one thousand seven hundred sixty dollars). If the appropriation proposed in the article is not approved, the default amount shall be deemed to have been approved. "With certain adjustments required by previous action of the Town of Winchester or by law; or the governing body may hold one special meeting, in accordance with RSA 40:13, X and XVI, to take up the issue of a revised operating budget only. (Majority vote required)
